

## **Notice of a Data Incident**

Indigo Sky Casino and Resort and Outpost Casino recently discovered unusual activity on our computer network. Upon identifying the issue, we promptly began an internal investigation, took steps to secure our systems, and notified law enforcement. We also engaged a forensic security firm to investigate and confirm the security of our computer systems. On December 1, 2023, we learned that an unknown third party acquired some documents from our system.

The documents at-issue may have contained employees' personal information, including names, driver's license numbers, Social Security numbers, and medical information. In addition, the documents may have contained some patron's names and Social Security and/or driver's license numbers. The documents did not contain banking information or other financial information.

On January 10, 2024, we mailed notification letters to those individuals whose information may have been in the documents and for whom we had a valid mailing address. We are also offering them complimentary credit monitoring and identity theft protection services.

Individuals should refer to the notice they receive in the mail regarding steps they can take to protect themselves. As a precautionary measure, individuals should remain vigilant to protect against potential fraud and/or identity theft by, among other things, reviewing their account statements and monitoring credit reports closely. If individuals detect any suspicious activity on an account, they should promptly notify the financial institution or company with which the account is maintained and report any fraudulent activity or any suspected incidents of identity theft to proper law enforcement authorities, including the police and their state's attorney general. Individuals may also wish to review the tips provided by the Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") on fraud alerts, security/credit freezes and steps that they can take to avoid identity theft.
